



Method Of Teaching Listening For Students

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Abstract: *Listening is a crucial ability in language because it allows pupils to construct language such as speaking and writing by using vocabulary learned via listening.*

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Introduction

One very important idea for teaching listening is that listening courses must make use of students' prior knowledge in order to improve listening comprehension. To make this idea clear, this section introduces several concepts from the cognitive view of language learning, including schema, scripts, and top down processing. This section also considers the similarities and differences between listening and reading, and then looks specifically at why the activation of prior knowledge is perhaps even more important in listening than in reading comprehension. Finally, there is a concrete example of activating prior knowledge in listening materials.

- pose questions
- do not attempt to spread
- feel the sensation
